



- Respondents to French survey = 6


FSC Survey Respondents (n=39)





Duration of Membership


Survey Respondents' Length of FSC Membership (n=38)


Other activities include:





Food Secure Canada's Work

(n=36)





Average Member Ranking for Most Important Areas of FSC's Current Work Listed from Most Important (1) to Least Important (7) (n=32)






Election Issues

(rated by respondents out of 5)




 All issues raised by members strongly relate to FSC's vision of a food system for Canadians founded on three pillars: health, justice and sustainability

Survey Respondents Select FSC's Top Three Most Valued Information Areas (n=31)




Membership Fees

Are FSC Membership Fees Reasonable? (n=31)

General Conclusions:

- Vast majority of respondents felt that FSC's membership fees are reasonable for their organization
- However, local community organization, professional organization, and farmers/ fishers association members predominantly indicated that the fees were not reasonable for their organizations



Next Step:

• FSC could review and revise the current fee structure to remove the affordability barrier for organizations of these types, resulting in a higher number of members



Other Benefits FSC Could Provide

- Increased participation from farmers and indigenous communities
- Organize organizational summit meetings
- Enhanced advocacy training opportunities (beyond the assemblies and webinars)
- More research-based resources (provincial and international comparisons)
- More policy and legislation updates
